Minutes

I. Call to order

II. Report out on CCP Executive Committee meeting 8/17/2016

This meeting was cancelled.

Bill explained that this month’s Executive meeting was cancelled.

III. Update on CCP plan implementation

Brief review current status of CCRC staffing and Community Corrections Partnership plan program service elements and other executive-body approved actions.

- Shaun/Probation ~ SRP is down a Senior Probation Officer and a Probation Officer. The rest of AB109 folks are fully staffed. The first batch of data has gone to HSU for the Data Warehouse Project. Bill explained the project and that it has been going on for a year.
- Duane/Jail ~ the netting that was approved will be going out to bid. The body scanner is very helpful. The approved mail scanner has not yet been purchased. There are 19 employee vacancies at the jail.
- Donna/DHHS ~ they have a clinician vacancy because supervisor Mark Lamers was promoted to Program Manager and Donna was promoted to supervisor. A Case Manager was just hired; start date unknown.
- Wes/Crossroads ~ they currently have 13 AB109 clients. Budget and staffing are good. Amy said billing Medi-cal is still being worked on.
- Bill and Duane discussed the jail data. Duane discussed SWAP participation. Bill talked about the DHHS data and probation data. Data and definitions of homelessness were discussed.

Open discussion of the ongoing or emerging impacts on the community of Public Safety Realignment.

Kitty discussed overdoses at the Library and wanted to know what happens after the person goes to the hospital. Duane explained what usually happens. Amy added information on Semper Virens.
