AGENDA ITEMS DETAILS**Agenda Item I****Memorandum of Understanding with Humboldt County Economic Development Division**

The Samoa Peninsula EIFD is a special district independent of the County of Humboldt, and as such, the District will require an agreement with County in order to receive general staffing support. The County Administrative Office has recommended that the Humboldt County Economic Development Division (HCEDD) act as general staffing to the District, as it has acted in this capacity for the duration of the Authority Board and the EIFD.

The Memorandum of Understanding by and between the District and the Humboldt County Economic Development Division (Attachment 2.1) outlines the general rights and responsibilities of the Economic Development Division under the agreement and how such work will be compensated.

Under this MOU, the rights and responsibilities of HCEDD will include, but are not limited to;

- a. Scheduling and administering meetings of the Authority Board.
- b. Preparing the District's Annual Report.
- c. Meeting with District partners and reporting out on those meetings to the Authority Board.
- d. Drafting and executing agreements for professional services and partnerships, as directed by the Authority Board.
- e. Performing fiscal duties, including, but not limited to receiving and paying invoices, tracking expenditures and revenues, and ensuring annual auditing requirements are met.
- f. Carrying out additional Authority Board directives, when such directives do not exceed HCEDD's budget for providing general support to the Authority Board.

Under this MOU, HCEDD will be compensated for the costs incurred during the formation of the District and for general staffing through accrued tax increment revenue in the following ways.

- a. The District will provide up to 10 percent of any accrued tax increment revenue during the first two years of the effective date of the District for any costs incurred during its formation, per EIFD Law.
- b. The District will provide up to \$35,000 annually for general administration of the EIFD, per the District's IFP.

Recommended Action:

It is staff's recommendation that the Authority Board;

1. Enter into, and ratify, this Memorandum of Understanding by and between the District and the Humboldt County Economic Development Division.

Agenda Item II**Updates to REAP 2.0 Application**

Following direction by your Board to pursue the State's Regional Early Action Planning Grants Program (REAP 2.0), staff now recommends that the EIFD NOT submit an application for funding for the following reasons;

1. Proposed uses related to transit operations, brought before your Board previously, have been deemed in eligible by the State's Housing and Community Development Department. As previously stated, the EIFD must partner with the Humboldt Transit Authority on any application for funding through REAP 2.0, and because the proposed uses relevant to the transit program have been declared ineligible, we believe such a partnership would not be feasible.
2. Staff has learned that the County Planning & Building Department will be pursuing their own application for funding, on behalf of the County, to expand and support current affordable housing programs. Supporting this program, rather than competing with it, may be the best way to support affordable housing for the Peninsula's growing workforce.

Recommended Action:

It is staff's recommendation that the Authority Board;

1. Direct Staff to draft and submit a letter on behalf of the District, authorized by the Chair, to the County Planning & Building Department in support of their REAP 2.0 application.

Agenda Item III**Memorandum of Understanding with the Wiyot Tribe**

Following direction from your board to seek out partnerships with aligned organizations, staff has been in discussion with the Wiyot Tribe. Recognizing that the District lays on ancestral Wiyot land, and that Tribe expertise in natural, cultural, and community resources can be a valuable towards achieving the District's goals, it is staff recommendation that the District enter into an agreement with the Tribe to collaborate and align efforts around infrastructure development on the Samoa Peninsula.

Although original discussions with the Wiyot Tribe were to align efforts specifically around the REAP 2.0 program, this MOU still puts in place general guidelines for all future collaboration.

Recommended Action:

It is staff's recommendation that the Authority Board;

1. Ratify the Memorandum of Understanding by and between the District and the Wiyot Tribe

Agenda Item IV**Offshore Wind Preliminary Scoping Analysis**

The Humboldt Bay Offshore Wind Project will bring thousands of jobs to Humboldt County, hundreds of millions of dollars to the District, and billions of dollars to the North Coast Region. The District can help support this project, and other private development, by funding large infrastructure development projects on the Peninsula. The proposed Offshore Wind Preliminary Scoping Analysis (Attachment 4.1) will identify Economic Development and Infrastructure Opportunities for the Samoa Peninsula, which may support the Humboldt Bay Offshore Wind Project and other Economic Development on the Samoa Peninsula.

This Scoping Analysis is estimated to cost \$10,000. It is staff recommendation that the District fund this project through a reimbursement agreement with the Humboldt County Economic Development Division. The Humboldt County Economic Development Division will pay for this project out of its 22-23 Professional Services Budget, and be reimbursed by the District once revenue is available.

Since the District does not currently have an On-call District Engineer, it is staff recommendation that the District single source this Analysis with an outside consultant.

Upon completion of this analysis, staff will bring back identified infrastructure projects for consideration by your Board to be funded by the EIFD. Once projects are clearly identified, the EIFD may seek funding for these developments through traditional infrastructure loans, grants, or a combination there of.

Staff Recommendations:

It is staff's recommendation that the Authority Board;

1. Authorize staff to enter the District into a reimbursement agreement of \$10,000 with the Humboldt County Economic Development Division for the purpose of funding the Offshore Wind Preliminary Scoping Analysis.
2. Authorize staff to enter into a Professional Services Agreement with their chosen consultant to execute the Offshore Wind Preliminary Scoping Analysis.

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BY AND BETWEEN
THE SAMOA PENINSULA ENHANCED INFRASTRUCTURE FINANCING DISTRICT
AND
HUMBOLDT COUNTY, COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE - ECONOMIC
DEVELOPMENT DIVISION**

This Memorandum of Understanding (“MOU”) is entered into this ____ day of _____ by and between the Samoa Peninsula Enhanced Infrastructure Financing District (“District”) and the Humboldt County, County Administrative Office - Economic Development Division (“HCEDD”), collectively “the Parties”.

WHEREAS, the Resolution of Intention of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Humboldt to establish the Samoa Peninsula Enhanced Infrastructure Financing District (Resolution NO. 21-68) was adopted on June 29, 2021; and,

WHEREAS, the District was established on March 1, 2022, pursuant to Chapter 2.99 of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5 of the California Government Code (commencing with Section 53398.50) (the EIFD Law); and,

WHEREAS, the District’s Infrastructure Financing Plan (the IFP) was prepared by HCEDD in accordance with Sections 53398.62 and 53398.63 of the EIFD Law; and,

WHEREAS, HCEDD incurred the cost and responsibility of planning and dissemination of information during the formation of the District and adoption of the IFP; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the EIFD Law Section 53398.76, all costs incurred by the County of Humboldt in connection with the division of taxes for the District shall be paid for by the District; and,

WHEREAS, the District requires general staffing and resources in order to carry out its goals outlined in the IFP Section 7.0.

NOW THEREFORE, based on the terms recited above, the Parties enter into this memorandum of understanding:

1. **Recitals.** The Parties find and determine that all the foregoing recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein.
2. **Rights and Responsibilities.** HCEDD shall provide general staffing support to the District’s governing body, the Authority Board, including but not limited to:
 - a. Scheduling and administering meetings of the Authority Board.
 - b. Preparing the District’s Annual Report (See Section 6, Reporting).
 - c. Meeting with District partners and reporting out on those meetings to the Authority Board.
 - d. Drafting and executing agreements for professional services and partnerships, as directed by the Authority Board.
 - e. Performing fiscal duties, including, but not limited to receiving and paying invoices,

tracking expenditures and revenues, and ensuring annual auditing requirements are met.

- f. Carrying out additional Authority Board directives, when such directives do not exceed HCEDD's budget for providing general support to the Authority Board.
3. **Term.** This MOU shall be retroactively effective as of July 1, 2022 and shall remain in full force and effect until June 30th 2027, unless sooner terminated as provided herein.
4. **Compensation.**
 - a. The District shall reimburse HCEDD for costs incurred during the planning and formation of the District up to ten-percent (10%) of any accrued tax increment revenue during the first two years of the effective date of the District, in accordance with Section 53398.69 of the EIFD Law.
 - b. The District shall reimburse HCEDD for any indirect and/or direct costs associated with staffing support, as identified in Section 2, Rights and Responsibilities, for the District Authority Board, in an amount not to exceed thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000) annually, through accrued tax increment revenue. Work which exceeds thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000) must be paid for through a separate agreement with HCEDD.
5. **Payment.** HCEDD shall submit to the County Auditor Controller a monthly journal entry itemizing all services rendered, and costs and expenses incurred, pursuant to the terms and conditions of this MOU. Payment shall be journaled from the Samoa Peninsula EIFD Fund to Economic Development's General Fund.
6. **Reporting.** HCEDD shall prepare the District's Annual Report in accordance with EIFD Law Section 53398.66(j)(3), to include, without limitation:
 - a. A description of the projects undertaken in the fiscal year, including any rehabilitation of structures, and a comparison of the progress expected to be made on those projects compared to the actual progress.
 - b. A chart comparing the actual revenues and expenses, including administrative costs, of the public financing authority to the budgeted revenues and expenses.
 - c. The amount of tax increment revenues received.
 - d. An assessment of the status regarding completion of the enhanced infrastructure financing district's projects.
 - e. The amount of revenues expended to assist private businesses.
 - f. A description of all HCEDD staffing costs and services, and a staffing budget for the following year.
7. **Amendments.** This MOU may be amended at any time upon the mutual consent of both parties. No addition to, or alteration of, the terms of this MOU shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by the parties hereto.
8. **Termination.**

- a. **Termination for Cause.** The Parties may, in their sole discretion, immediately terminate this Agreement, if either party fails to adequately perform the services required hereunder, fails to comply with the terms or conditions set forth herein, or violates any local, state or federal law, regulation or standard applicable to its performance hereunder.
 - b. **Termination without Cause.** HCEDD may terminate this Agreement without cause upon thirty (30) days advance written notice which states the effective date of the termination.
 - c. **Termination due to Insufficient Funding.** HCEDD's obligations under this Agreement are contingent upon the availability of local, state and/or federal funds. In the event such funding is reduced or eliminated, HCEDD shall, at its sole discretion, determine whether this Agreement shall be terminated. HCEDD shall provide the District seven (7) days advance written notice of its intent to terminate this Agreement due to insufficient funding.
9. **Severability.** If any section, subsection, phrase or clause of this MOU is for any reason found to be invalid, such section, subsection, phrase or clause shall be severed from, and shall not affect the validity of, all remaining portions of this MOU that can be given effect without the severed portion.
10. **Mutual Indemnification.** Each party agrees to defend, indemnify and hold the other party, its officers, employees, and agents harmless from and against any and all liability, loss, expense (including reasonable attorneys' fees), or claims for injury or damages arising out of the performance of this MOU, but only in proportion to and to the extent such liability, loss, expense, attorneys' fees or claims for injury or damages are caused by or result from the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of the party, its officers, employees, or agents.
11. **General Authorization.** All officers and agents of the Parties are hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary or advisable to give effect to the transactions contemplated by this MOU.
12. **Counterpart Execution.** This MOU, and any amendments hereto, may be executed in one (1) or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original and all of which, when taken together, shall be deemed to be one (1) and the same agreement. This MOU, and any amendments hereto, may be signed by manual or electronic signatures in accordance with any and all applicable local, state and federal laws, regulations and standards, and such signatures shall constitute original signatures for all purposes. A signed copy of this MOU, and any amendments hereto, transmitted by email or by other means of electronic transmission shall be deemed to have the same legal effect as delivery of an original executed copy of this MOU and any amendments hereto.
13. **Authority to Execute.** Each person executing this MOU represents and warrants that he or she is duly authorized and has legal authority to execute and deliver this MOU. Each party represents and warrants to the other that the execution and delivery of this MOU and the performance of such party's obligations hereunder have been duly authorized.

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE
SAMOA PENINSULA ENHANCED INFRASTRUCTURE FINANCING DISTRICT AND
THE WIYOT TRIBE
TO ESTABLISH GENERAL CONDITIONS AND GUIDELINES FOR COLLABORATION
IN FUTURE INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES OF THE SAMOA
PENINSULA**

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is entered into this 14 day of Nov by and between the Samoa Peninsula Enhanced Infrastructure Financing District ("District") and the Wiyot Tribe ("Tribe"), collectively "the Parties".

WHEREAS, the District is located on ancestral Wiyot land; and,

WHEREAS, the Tribe has expertise in the natural and cultural resources of the Samoa Peninsula, affordable housing developments, and other activities which may be beneficial to infrastructure development; and,

WHEREAS, the District will invest in infrastructure on the Samoa Peninsula to support new development, and;

WHEREAS, the Parties recognize the benefits of collaboration around future infrastructure development on the Samoa Peninsula, and;

WHEREAS, the Tribe has assigned the Tribal Administrator, Dishgamu Humboldt Community Land Trust Director, or an assigned delegate chosen by them, to represent the Tribe in collaboration with the District around the REAP 2 projects.

WHEREAS, both the District and the Tribe may apply for Regional Early Action Planning (REAP 2.0) grants through the State's Department of Housing and Community Development to help the North Coast Region meet housing and climate goals.

NOW THEREFORE, based on the terms recited above, the Parties enter into this memorandum of understanding:

1. **Recitals.** The Parties find and determine that all the foregoing recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein.
2. **Information Sharing.** The Parties agree to open sharing of resources, data, information, funding opportunities and other items related to infrastructure development on the Samoa Peninsula to the extent possible while adhering to applicable laws and regulations governing confidentiality of such information.
3. **Meetings.** The parties agree to quarterly re-occurring staff meetings and coordination.
4. **Collaboration.** The Parties agree to an on-going commitment to work towards alignment of infrastructure development strategies on the Samoa Peninsula where possible and, where necessary, towards strategies that are well-coordinated and complementary. This may include collaboration on REAP 2.0 funded project, if such projects further the goals of the program, the District, and the Tribe.
5. **Consultation Services.** The Tribe agrees to provide consultation services to the District for infrastructure development projects, if such services align with the goals of the District, the

Tribe, and the project. Terms and conditions for consultation services will be outlined in a separate Professional Service Agreement.


6. **Amendments.** Any party may initiate an amendment to this MOU by written request. Any proposed amendment must be mutually agreed upon by the Parties.
7. **Effective Date.** This MOU shall be effective upon ratification by the District's Authority Board.
8. **Severability** If any section, subsection, phrase or clause of this MOU is for any reason found to be invalid, such section, subsection, phrase or clause shall be severed from, and shall not affect the validity of, all remaining portions of this Resolution that can be given effect without the severed portion.
9. **General Authorization.** All officers and agents of the Parties are hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary or advisable to give effect to the transactions contemplated by this MOU.
