- An overview of wardship numbers per month from 2002-2020 was assessed and showed a decline in numbers.

- Juvenile referral numbers have also been on the decline since 2012.
- The detention facility population has trended downward from 2007-2020.
- The Juvenile Justice Action Strategy was presented, and a discussion took place regarding gaps in services.

Sacha motions to release \$150,000.00 per year for the next 3 years with the grant.

Judge Elvine-Kreis seconded the motion.

A vote was taken, and the motion was carried unanimously.
