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### Minutes

#### I. Call to order

Chief of Probation Shaun Brenneman called the meeting to order at 12:15pm. In attendance was: Justin Nadigoo, Wes Harrison, Coral Sanders, Amber Miller, and Ron Bates.

#### II. Report out on CCP Executive Committee meeting 03/17/2021

*Review agenda items covered, discussions held and actions taken.*

Coral Sanders provided a summary of the March CCP Executive Committee meeting:

- The Action item for Short Term Assessment of Risk and Treatability (START) training was approved. DHHS received a grant to allow for a mental health diversion program. This training will allow this agency to train staff who will be working within this program.

#### III. Update on CCP plan implementation

Wes Harrison/Crossroads: Crossroads has moved into the Partnership model at the program. This has increased access to treatment. There has been a trend of less releases from jail and directly into treatment since this model has taken place. Clients are still able to enter treatment within a couple of days after their release. Overall, the program is doing very well after their transition into Drug Medi-Cal.

Amber Miller/Yurok Tribe: Experiencing some hurdles with information gathering to assist their programs such as diversion and wellness court. Just began using the assessment tool Noble for their clients. This is a tool Probation also uses which could provide the opportunity to share information through this platform. A new case worker could potentially be hired in the future.

Coral Sanders/Probation: Probation has both promotional and new recruitments currently open. The prison population being released due to COVID concerns has stabilized. Community Corrections Resource Center's (CCRC) mental health is

fully staffed. CCRC is working on bringing all staff back to the office full-time and opening to the doors to the public again. There are still probation officers working with the Emergency Operation Center (EOC), providing transportation needs.

Justin Nadigoo/Probation: CCRC is looking at continuing their contract with Arcata House that provides housing and services to PRCS clients.
