IV. Presentation Yurok Tribe History and Yurok Veteran’s Court

Laura Woods and Jessica Wolsfeld from the Yurok Tribal Court will present.
Laura Woods and Jessica Wolsfeld from the Yurok Tribal Court were in attendance to present this agenda item.

- Introductions were made.
- A video was presented to the committee on the background history of Yurok culture, language, and ceremonies. The premise was to depict the Yurok tribe’s past, present, and plans for the future.

Jessica presented a PowerPoint on the Yurok Tribe’s Veteran’s Wellness Court.

- The history of the Yurok Tribal Court was discussed.

- The mission of the Yurok Veterans Wellness Court is to address underlying causes of criminal behaviors and reduce recidivism through wellness and recovery support services.
- Any Native American veteran is eligible for this program located in Humboldt, Trinity, and Del Norte county with charges related to drugs and alcohol, theft, or violence.
- The phases of the Yurok Veterans Wellness Court were discussed.
