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### Minutes

#### I. Call to order

Chief Probation Officer Shaun Brenneman called the meeting to order at 12:15pm. In attendance was: Darren Ghisetti, Coral Sanders, Michelle Tucker, Wes Harrison, Britain Davis, and Lynn Kerman.

#### II. Report out on CCP Executive Committee meeting 04/17/2019

Chief Brenneman reported out on the Executive Committee meeting:

#### III. Update on CCP plan implementation

*Partnership plan program service elements and other executive-body approved actions.*

- Coral Sanders/Probation: The Arcata House pilot program with Probation should kick off the first week in May. This pilot program will allow 5 PRCS clients to live in stable housing that provides case management services and assists them with re-entry into society.
- Darren Ghisetti/Probation: 13 PRCS clients will be released this month to Probation. The Realignment Unit will begin screening these clients for possible entry into the Arcata House.
- Wes Harrison/NCSAC: A request for Measure Z funds made by NCSAC was not considered. No Measure Z funds will be received. Some funding was received from DHHS with the assistance of DHHS Director Connie Beck. NCSAC's Drug Medi-Cal application has been submitted.
- Lynn Kerman/RCAA: 1 part-time case management specialist has been hired. An additional part-time case management specialist is still needed.

The current case managers are doing well and have been participating in motivational interviewing. The first set of data for the calendar year has been submitted to Probation.

Britain Davis, current intern at NCSAC, reported that he will be opening a new clean and sober house on 15<sup>th</sup> Street in Eureka on May 20<sup>th</sup>. The house will have 4 bedrooms containing 10 beds and will be abstinence based with drug testing on-site. There will be 2 house managers to assist those living in the house. The projected cost for clients will be \$440/month.
