I. CALL TO ORDER & INTRODUCTION OF ATTENDEES

Shaun Brenneman called the meeting to order at 4:06pm and initiated a round of self-introductions.

II. ADJUSTMENTS TO AGENDA (Inquiry of Attendees for additions/subtractions/changes for the current agenda)

No adjustments to the agenda were made.

III. PUBLIC COMMENT (Limited to three (3) minutes per person, per item)

No public comments were made.

IV. APPROVAL OF MINUTES for 02/22/18 (Inquiry of attendees for additions/subtractions/changes and approval of the minutes of the last meeting).

Approval of the 02/22/18 MAJJCC minutes was postponed until the August meeting due to low member attendance. Six (6) members are necessary to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of members.

V. PROGRAM (10-15minutes): Gillian Wadsworth from HCOE to present an update on Truancy.

Jillian Wadsworth from HCOE provided a background on School Attendance Court. In this court, parents are referred rather than their children. Within the first year of implementation, there was an 86% turnaround on attendance for non-high school students. It was noticed that the younger the student, the better the outcome was. Currently, there are 33 students in the "school attendance system," for School Attendance Court. These 33 students are comprised of 26 different families.

School Attendance Court allows local schools to use the SARB process. It is hoped that the use of this process will take place early on in a child's life rather than waiting until the child hits high school.

There has been issues in regards to how to yield better outcomes with older students in grades 9-12.

Truancy court currently takes place every 2nd and 4th Friday at 1:30pm. In August, this schedule will change to the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of every month at 3:30pm.

VI. DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS: There are no discussion items at this time.

VII. AGENCY REPORTS/ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION OPEN TOPIC

Sacha Marini: An overview of Teen Court's 2017 annual report was given. 55 cases were handled, with most coming from the APD Diversion program and Eureka High School. Most cases were for AOD use, assault and battery, and petty theft. Out of the 46 successful cases to complete Teen Court, 4 of them re-offended. 88% of parents thought Teen Court had a positive impact. 80% of participants achieved the goals they had set for themselves.

Jody Green: Probation's numbers are remaining stable. There is currently 2 vacancies in the Juvenile Probation division. Currently updating the 781 sealing process.

Shaun Brenneman: The construction of the new Juvenile Hall is a little behind schedule. Phase 2 is about to start.
