Minutes

I. Call to order

Chief of Probation Shaun Brenneman called the meeting to order at 12:15pm. In attendance was Justin Nadigoo from Probation, Coral Sanders from Probation, District Supervisor Steve Madrone, Ron Bates from the Yurok Tribe, and Amber Miller from the Yurok Tribe.

II. Report out on CCP Executive Committee meeting 05/19/2021

Review agenda items covered, discussions held and actions taken.

Chief Brenneman reported out on last week's Executive HCCCP meeting:

- Action Item: amending a prior DHHS proposal to increase the funding amount to send staff to a CIT training. This action item was approved.
- Action Item: amendment to CCP plan for funding to improve the Public Defenders case management system. This action item was approved.
- Discussion of medical assisted treatment (MAT) inside of the jail.
- The CCP trust is currently at \$2.7 million.

III. Update on CCP plan implementation

Brief review current status of CCRC staffing and Community Corrections Partnership plan program service elements and other executive-body approved actions.

Coral Sanders/Probation: CCRC will be losing two staff members due to an internal promotion as well as an outside job opportunity. Probation will be shifting staff to cover these vacancies. Probation and Mental Health staff have worked together to address the increase in clients experiencing mental health crises. Staff have seen an improvement due to these efforts.

Amber Miller/Yurok Tribe: Ron Bates was recently hired as the re-entry case worker to provide case management services to those recently released from incarceration. Yurok Coming Home Houses are now being utilized by those that qualify for the housing. Open discussion of the ongoing or emerging impacts on the community of Public Safety Realignment.

- A discussion took place regarding the success client's and people in the community have had with suboxone and Buprenorphine.
- Chief Brenneman stated that the jail has begun to operate as they were pre-pandemic which will result in an increase in those who are booked into the HCCF.
- Supervisor Madrone stated that they are working with Hoopa regarding a housing project to create tiny homes.
