Minutes

I. Call to order

Division Director Coral Sanders called the meeting to order at 12:20pm. In attendance was Justin Nadigoo from Probation, Michelle Tucker from Probation, Ronald Bates from the Yurok Tribe, and Amber Miller from the Yurok Tribe.

II. Report out on CCP Executive Committee meeting 06/16/2021

Review agenda items covered, discussions held and actions taken.

Coral Sanders reported out on the previous Executive HCCCP meeting:

- More funds will be allocated to a future de-escalation training. A change in venue to Arizona is the reasoning behind the increase in cost.
- The Humboldt State University Police Department has also expressed an interest in benefitting from de-escalation training, even potentially offering HSU as a host site. They have also indicated that even professors have expressed interest in receiving this training.
- \$40,000.00 was allocated for the Eureka Police Department to establish their own in-house de-escalation training so as to have them more frequently and to have them be malleable to community context.
- The budget is in good shape. The economic impacts due to COVID-19 were not as severe as anticipated. The CCP may not have to fund residential treatment moving forward due to Drug-MediCal coverage, but the technicalities are still being worked out.

III. Update on CCP plan implementation

Brief review current status of CCRC staffing and Community Corrections Partnership plan program service elements and other executive-body approved actions.

Justin Nadigoo/Probation: The process of getting referrals for inmates in the Humboldt County Correctional Facility to then getting them appropriate treatment is going much more smoothly ever since the negative impacts of COVID-19.

Open discussion of the ongoing or emerging impacts on the community of Public Safety Realignment.

- Ronald Bates expressed interest in following the status of de-escalation training in the county.
