6. Presentation: Navigation Center	a) Hannah Ozanian who is a consultant with DHHS reported she is here today to give the Board a presentation on the Navigation Center that is being planned for Eureka. She is a member of a team working on this with DHHS staff and the city of Eureka. Plans are in place and they are still gathering information. They are partnering with Redwood Community Services on this. Hannah reported she has experience running a shelter as she was the Director at Friendship Park Day center in Sacramento. That facility serviced 600-1000 people and provided basic services and access to resources. They served men, women and children and provided hot showers, kennels for pets, meals, legal services, bike storage, eligibility access, storage lockers and a women's center. The facility opened in the 1990s . There was a review of the map of the property which showed the buildings for the facilities.	Informational	

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6. Presentation: Navigation Center	<p>b) Hannah reported that the Humboldt Navigation Center objectives will be to develop a central location on 3rd and Central streets in Eureka near the St. Vincent DePaul and Betty Chin facilities and to engage and aid those in need. They will provide respite care for those who need a place to stay during the day. The focus will be to get homeless clients into permanent supportive housing and be service orientated. There will be access to case managers and social workers, SUD counselors, outreach, and hygiene services. There is also plans for a computer center and classrooms. Services will be dedicated to case management and to assist in the transition to permanent housing. The facility has plans to offer a bike station, storage, and pet kennels for clients. The operating agency for the facility will be Redwood Community Services. They are currently operating shelters in other counties.</p> <p>c) Hannah reviewed the floor plans of the proposed facility and there also will be 24-hour security, staff trained in de-escalation and EPD will have a space for their safety team</p> <p>d) Connie Beck reported that the County and the City of Eureka have been meeting and working on plans for the Navigation Center and all the permitting for the building has been completed. There will be funding provided by DHHS and the City of Eureka. Connie reported that she will keep the Board updated on this project and Tim Doty asked if the Board could keep this on their agenda to make sure they get updates. Connie reported that there is a community meeting on the facility scheduled for August 23rd. Questions from the Board members included will children and families be able to have access and are there any age restrictions. Connie reported that these details are being worked out and that there will be DHHS staff on site to assist clients. Lived experience coaches and volunteers will also be part of the program. Will urgent psychiatric services be available on site? Connie reported probably not as there is a shortage of physicians in the county.</p>	Informational
