Minutes

I. Call to order

Chief Probation Officer Shaun Brenneman called the meeting to order at 12:15pm. In attendance was: Lynn Kerman, Wes Harrison, Deborah Hubbard, Coral Sanders, Michelle Tucker, and Justin Nadigoo.

II. Report out on CCP Executive Committee meeting 08/21/2019

Review agenda items covered, discussions held and actions taken.

Chief Brenneman provided a report out on the August Executive CCP meeting:

- A funding request for DHHS was approved to send staff to Hostage Negotiation Training.
- A new funding request form has been created and will soon be on the HCCCP's webpage.
- An update of the Sequential Intercept Mapping sub-committee group was given.

III. Update on CCP plan implementation

Brief review current status of CCRC staffing and Community Corrections Partnership plan program service elements and other executive-body approved actions.

Shaun Brenneman/Probation: There are currently 9 vacancies in Probation, 2 of which are AB109 positions.

Lynn Kerman/RCAA: There are currently 1.5 case managers spending their time between WRS and HRC. Current case managers have been attending community trainings. RCAA is in the process of opening two new housing units. RCAA would like a meeting with the HCCCP Executive Committee to discuss funding to extend the case management program with Probation. Both Lynn and Wes expressed the benefits the programs have received with the assistance of the case managers.

Wes Harrison/NCSAC: AB109 client numbers are currently low at Crossroads. A discussion took place as to why that is. Partnership Health has requested W9's from the treatment program, moving them further along in the Medi-Cal process.

IV. Public Comment (as time permits)

Open discussion of the ongoing or emerging impacts on the community of Public Safety Realignment.

A discussion took place regarding how drug medi-cal will affect clientele at local treatment programs.
