<p>7. Presentation: CSET</p>	<p>a) Commander Lenard Lafrance from the Eureka Police department reported he is here to give the Board a presentation on CSET (Community Safety Team). The program started in 2018 and he has put together a team. The focus is on assisting those with homelessness, addiction and mental illness get the services they need and to keep them out of the jail system. There is staffing from MIST, Waterfront Recovery and Community service rangers and a Mental Health Clinician. The staff connects with the community and other agencies to maintain order and help others. One of the principles is that Homelessness is not a crime, but critical behavior is. There is a focus on criminal behavior and causes and to reach out to people where they are. Staff try to streamline services for the homeless. Staff also try to build relationships and partnerships, identify locations and individuals causing problems and to find long -term solutions and connect people to resources. Staff does a lot of outreach, relationship building and de-escalation while trying to connect people to DHHS services and other agencies. Some data is tracked for response calls, warm hand offs to SUD services and assisting with 5150s. Funding for the program comes from the General Fund and Measure Z. A question-and-answer period followed the presentation and the Board thanked Commander LaFrance for his presentation today.</p>	<p>Informational</p>
