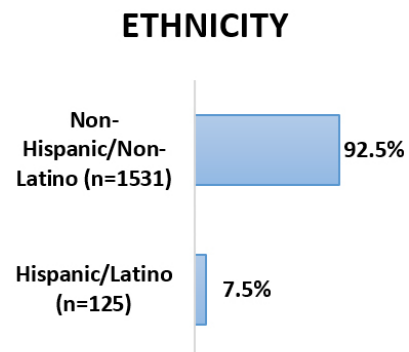
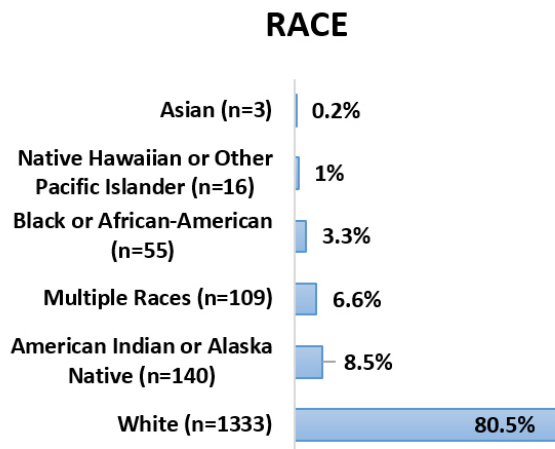
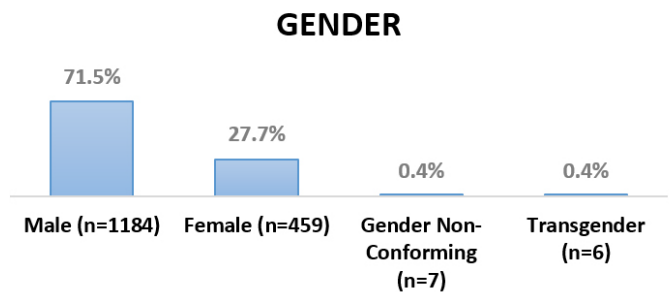
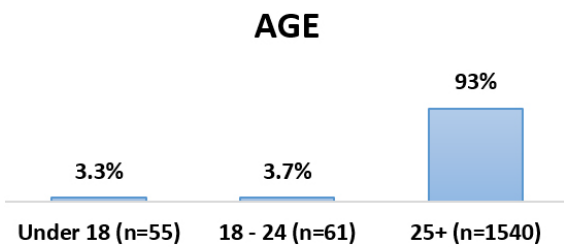
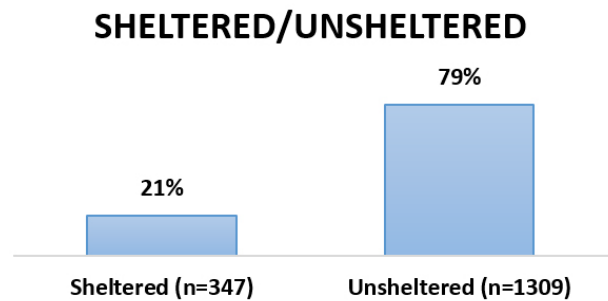
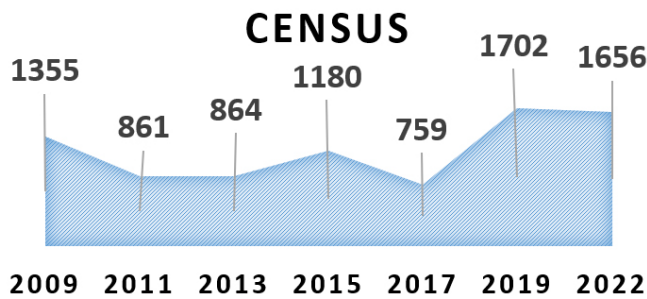


# HUMBOLDT HOUSING & HOMELESS COALITION

## Subpopulation Summary

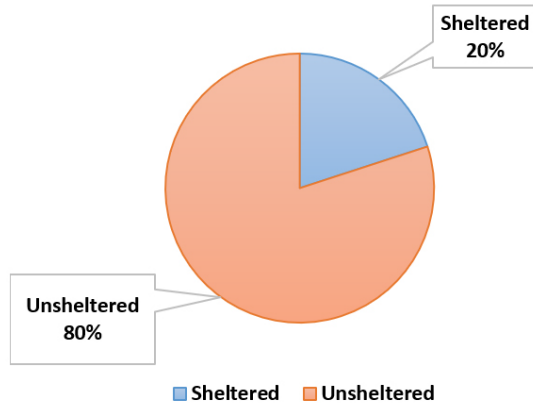
### Chronically Homeless

An individual with a disabling condition or a family with a head of household with a disabling condition who:

- Has been continuously homeless on the streets and in shelters for 1 year or more, or
- Has experienced 4 or more episodes of homelessness totaling at least 12 months on the streets and in shelters in the past 3 years.

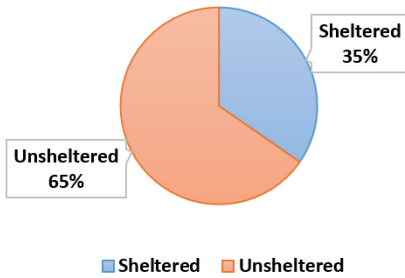

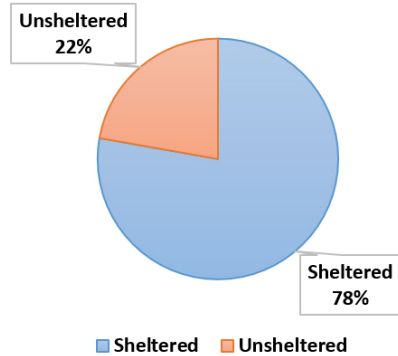

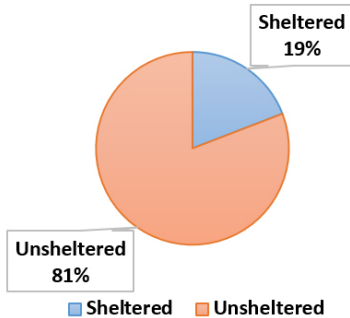

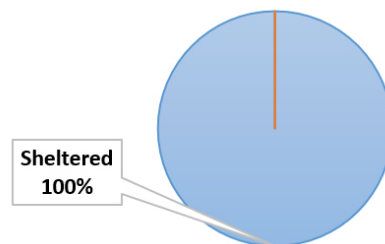

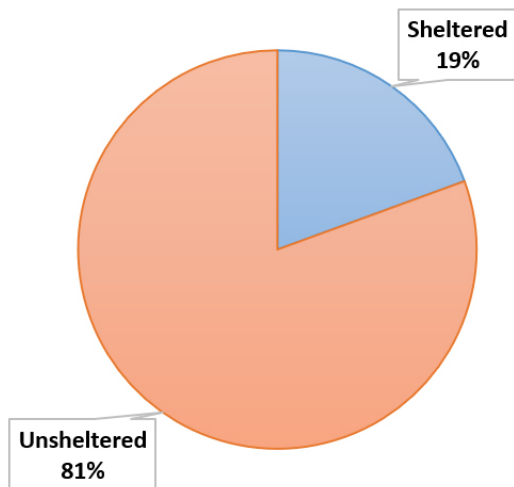

## Behavioral Health

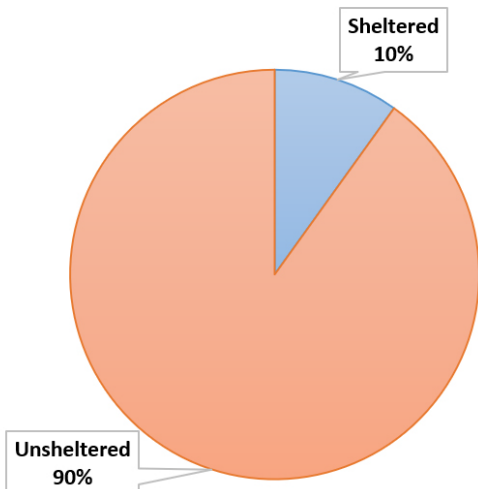
A disabling behavioral health condition is defined here as a substance use disorder or serious mental illness that is expected to be long-continuing or of indefinite duration and substantially impedes the individual's ability to live independently. These data were only collected for persons age 18 and above.

### Adults with a Serious Mental Illness n=767



**48% of adults surveyed reported a serious mental illness.**

### Adults with a Substance Use Disorder n=786



**49% of adults surveyed reported a substance use disorder.**
