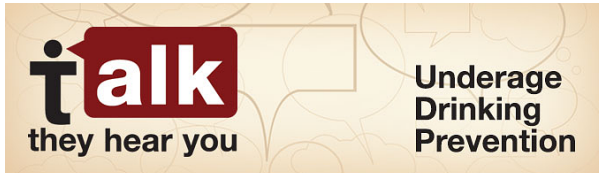

Eligibility:

Youth must have Humboldt County Medi-Cal. Please contact the program directly for a screening or call Carelon, the 24 hour Substance Use Disorder (SUD) access line, at 855-765-9703.

Treatment Program:

ATP offers outpatient treatment for young people ages 12 to 18 with a substance use disorder (SUD). Services are designed to empower participants to make positive and permanent changes in their lives. This program is designed to provide care to clients in their community, home, or the office.

Services Available:

- American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) Assessment
- Individual and group counseling
- Field services, including transportation
- Case management
- Recovery services
- Life skills development.

About YOUth Choose:

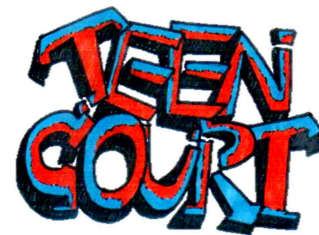
Anonymous and confidential. Free alcohol and other drug early intervention for teens ages 13 to 18. 3 interactive sessions are one-on-one with an adult facilitator. Program is voluntary or court-ordered. Service providers, caregivers or youth can call for an appointment.

Sessions Cover:

- Choices and consequences
- Gauging readiness to change
- Identifying resources and supports
- Empowering youth to make positive changes through an action plan.

Who should attend?

- Youth who have mild to moderate alcohol or other drug use
- Youth who are considering whether or not to use
- Youth who are completing probation, court, or Teen Court requirements because of school or legal issues.

What is Teen Court?

- Teen Court is a diversion program for youth ages 13 to 18 who have committed first time offenses. It's a real court run by teens for teens including a teen judge, jury, and attorneys. It is an alternative approach to the juvenile justice system.
- The teen jury decides on restorative assignments and often makes referrals to YOUth Choose-for Substance Experimenting Teens.

Why use Teen Court?

- Teen Court follows restorative justice principles. Youth learn how the justice system operates and their rights and responsibilities in that system. It is designed to empower youth to make choices and to develop positive connections with adults.
- Service providers, caregivers, or youth can call for an appointment.
