Nov. 14 – Dec. 9 (E-113 – E-88)	Candidate Nomination Period Candidates obtain and file their declaration of candidacy for district board and, if applicable, file candidate's statement of qualifications. Forms obtained from and filed with the county elections office, 2426 6 th Street, Eureka. §10505, 10509, 10510, 13307, 13311

<p>Dec. 9 (E-88)</p>	<p>Official Filing Date Deadline for Ballot Measure</p> <p>Final deadline for the governing body of a district or other political subdivision which requests consolidation of a local election for candidates and/or <u>measures</u> to file the request with the elections office.</p> <p>Whenever resolutions calling for a measure to be placed on the ballot are filed, immediately after the filing date there will be a 10-day public inspection period. Documents will be on public display at the elections office, 2426 6th Street, Eureka. <p>Dec. 15 (E-82)</p>	<p>Deadline to File Arguments for Measures (date chosen by elections official)</p> <p>Arguments for or against any measure called for the March 7, 2023 election are due at the county elections office, 2426 6th Street, Eureka, by 5 p.m. Arguments are public after the 5 p.m. deadline.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">§9163, 9316</p>
<p>Dec. 16 – Dec. 27* (E-81 to E-70)</p>	<p>10 Day Public Inspection for Arguments</p> <p>10 day public inspection of arguments filed by the December 15 deadline. During the 10 calendar day public examination period provided by this section, any voter of the jurisdiction in which the election is being held, or the county elections official, may seek a writ of mandate or an injunction requiring any or all of the materials</p>

<p>Dec. 28 – Jan. 8 (E-69 to E-59)</p>	<p>10 Day Public Inspection for Rebuttals & Analyses</p> <p>10-day public inspection of arguments, analyses, rebuttals for measures filed by the December 27 deadline. <p>Jan. 9 – Feb. 21 (E-57 to E-14)</p>	<p>Write-in Candidate Filing Time</p> <p>Write-in candidates obtain and file their statements of candidacy and nomination papers for district boards. Forms obtained from and filed with the county elections office, 2426 6th Street, Eureka.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">§§8600, 8601</p>

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Feb. 6 – Feb. 28 (E-29 to E-7)	Vote-by-Mail Ballots with VIG Sent to Voters
Feb. 20 (E-15)	Close of Voter Registration Last day to register to vote in the March 7, 2023, election; residents of the proposed districts only.
March 7 (E)	Election Day Ballot must be received at the Elections Office, 2426 6 th Street, Eureka, a drop box or polling location in California by 8PM. Ballots post marked by Election Day and received within 7 days will be counted. §1000, 14212, 3020
March 9 – April 6 (E+2 to E+30)	Official Canvass The official canvass of precinct returns is to be completed during this time. §15301, 15372
April 6 (E+30)	Statement of Vote to Board of Supervisors and LAFCo – Certificates of Election Prepared The elections official shall prepare a certified statement of the results of the election and submit it to the county board of supervisors. The governing body shall declare the winners for each office and the results of each measure under its jurisdiction. The county elections official shall make and deliver to each person elected a certificate of election. §15372, 15400-15401 The elections official shall immediately, upon completion of any canvass, report the results to the executive officer of LAFCo. Government Code 57149
Within 5 Days after Canvass	Recount May Be Requested Within five (5) days after the completion of the

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	<p>official canvass, any voter may request a recount by filing a written request with the elections official and specifying that candidates and/or measures are to be recounted. The request may specify the order of the precincts for the recount, and the petitioning voter shall, before commencement of each day's recount, deposit such sum as the election official requires to cover costs.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">§15620 - 15634</p>
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
