Humboldt Community Resource List

The [Humboldt Community Resource List](#) (HCRL) is a PDF with hundreds of community resource listings. The HCRL is updated twice a year and covers areas including health, food, housing and employment. The audience for the HCRL is the assister, case manager, eligibility specialist, provider, social worker, etc., not the direct customer. Best used online as it is a large document. The HCRL has an easy to remember address: humboldt.gov/HCRL.

Humboldt Community Resource List - Urgent Needs

The [Urgent Needs](#) list is a quick one-page document that can be handed to clients, patients and other community members. It is also available in trifold [brochure format](#): email HCRL@co.humboldt.ca.us for copies.

Humboldt County Resource Card

The Humboldt County Resource Card is a business card-sized, water-resistant four panel card that lists critical resources. Cards are scored, however, cards are not pre-folded. Cards can be requested by e-mailing HCRL@co.humboldt.ca.us. A Spanish version is also available. Please do not order more than a three-month supply at a time. Cards are intended for use when wallet-sized and water-resistant is critical. Use the “Urgent Needs” brochure referenced above when possible.

North Coast Resource Hub

The [North Coast Resource Hub](#) is an interactive, mobile-friendly resource guide launched by the North Coast Health Improvement and Information Network (NCHIIN). Currently, resources are centered on services related to substance use disorder, stabilization services, crisis services and alternative pain management resources. The site allows for sorting, printing and emailing resources and can be translated in over 30 languages.

North Coast Care Connect

The [North Coast Care Connect \(Care Connect\)](#) is a network of health and social service providers (a Community Information Exchange) that have partnered to coordinate care for persons in need of assistance. When persons consent to share their information, partner agencies are able to share client information using a secure data platform and provide coordination and electronic referrals for services.

PHC has a [Humboldt Resource page](#), aimed at the end consumer. You can print on one topic to hand to a client/customer.

Geared toward the direct consumer more than the assister. 211 is available to call seven days a week, 24 hours a day and offers fast, free and confidential assistance from a resource specialist who can help an individual find and answer questions on local programs and resources. 211 has an online [Humboldt County Resource Directory](#).

Social Services Info Sheets

[Social Services Info Sheets](#) are one-page, two-sided documents written for the assister, case manager, eligibility specialist, provider, social worker, etc. Plain introductory language to more effectively communicate with community members. Info sheets are intended to be a beginner's base on which to build additional knowledge.

Behavioral Health Resources Page

DHHS-Behavioral Health has a one-stop webpage for people to get the documents they need laid out in a friendly, accessible way. Humboldt.gov/BHResources is the easy to remember address. Available documents include program overviews and contact lists, brochures and oft-requested forms such as a release of information form. Business cards with a QR code to the link are available.

Cal Poly Humboldt Housing Resources

Cal Poly Humboldt has a website—[Housing and Residence Life](#)—geared toward students and faculty. [Humboldt County Property Managers](#) is a PDF with the listings of names, phone numbers and links for Humboldt property managers that is developed for students but may be of use to others.

DHHS Housing “Info Sheets”

[DHHS Housing Supports](#) is a one-page document briefly summarizing some DHHS efforts, with some links and info. There is a specific info sheet for [CalWORKs housing supports](#).

Planning and Building Department (P&B)

P&B has a [Housing Division](#) that “works to increase the supply of affordable housing for residents in the unincorporated areas of the county.” The P&B page provides information about home buyer assistance programs, owner occupied housing repair programs, Accessory Dwelling Units, a link to property managers and more.
