Firewise Action Plan



The Honeydew Community Assessment was reviewed and accepted by the Honeydew Firewise Board/Lower Mattole Firesafe Council (LMFSC) on July 11th 2011, and it was decided to seek Firewise recognition. The following action plan was created and agreed on by the Board. Firefighters with the Honeydew Volunteer Fire Company (HVFC) provided guidance for the development of the assessment and the action plan.

Information brochures: Having information available to residents about how to fire-safe their property is very important. Fuels Reduction Projects: The Fire-adapted Landscapes and Safe Homes (FLASH) program administered by Humboldt County and executed through the LMFSC and the Mattole Restoration Council (MRC) will continue through the coming year. Host Firewise event at the annual Roll on the Mattole: The HVFD annual fundraiser is a great opportunity for the annual Firewise event. Many residents from the Honeydew and Petrolia areas come to this event every year. The LMFSC will provide staff and a booth to present Firewise information along with other fire safe resources for local residents. <p>Better road and driveway signs: The LMFSC will continue to help local neighborhoods with acquiring road signs and street address signs, and will work with Humboldt County to help residents figure out their address, and if necessary change addresses so that they make sense.</p>	<p>The LMFSC/Firewise Board, HVFC, and Humboldt County personnel</p>	<p>This is an ongoing project which will require funding to complete. Over the next year 3 road signs will be installed and 5 residents will be helped with addressing.</p>
<p>Water Storage: More fire water storage is needed in all neighborhoods in Honeydew. The LMFSC will continue to peruse funding to help residents with the cost of installing water tanks on their properties, as well as helping to install better fittings and adding to the water storage capacities of the HVFC.</p>	<p>The LMFSC/Firewise Board and the HVFC.</p>	<p>This is an ongoing project which will require funding to complete.</p>
<p>Keep the Fire Atlas up to date: The LMFSC along with the MRC will continue to update the Fire Atlas, as well as all of the volunteer firefighters who will be using it most.</p>	<p>The LMFSC/Firewise Board, the PVFD, the HVFC, and the MRC</p>	<p>This is an ongoing project. While handwritten updates can be made at any time, the master update will require funding in about 3 to 5 years.</p>
