The GPU has been being updated for a long time now. As I've stated in the past under an entire different Planning & Building Commission & entirely different B of S Commissioners, a noise that hinders someone's ability to rest & live in the comfort of their own home should be a priority according to state regulations. Though Supervisor Bohn spoke to Mr. Murphy of the compressor on his roof that emitted noise for as long as 7 years, the noise has stopped for approximately 9 months. This just proves there was something that could be done about it all along. I believe he tightened some rubber cushions under the compressors or something. A lot cheaper than the more than \$1000.00 a week he spends on advertisement to get people to shop there. I won't even mention the 17 or so added refrigeration units he's added to the store without permits. A noise ordinance sounded promising by some of the commissioners for awhile & it was supposed to have been brought up again in a few weeks. That was 3 years ago. The noise ordinance topic lasted about 6 minutes - with three of those minutes coming from me. I'm maintaining that we cannot go by decibel readings to end future problems. Most don't know how to read them in the first place. Without a noise ordinance, business owners can merely say "Sue me" which was what happened to me. A noise ordinance could at least read something to the effect of stating that "if a neighbor continues to be annoyed by a continuing noise that the person or business that is creating the problem, could be required to construct a sound buffer or create a method to alleviate the problem. In this case, the compressor has already started emitting noise again & I'm afraid that after you have updated the GPU, the noise will be back to the level it was, & I won't have a leg to stand on again. Come up with something that's fair. I've been immediately affected by a problem & ignored way too long. Only some sort of ordinance will work. I'm asking that this be put back onto the agenda. Mr. Bohn said an ordinance can be enacted anytime. Well, how about while you're updating the GPU? Please provide me with some sort of response so I know that this branch of our local government is doing something to try& help me.
