City of Blue Lake Project Narrative Measure Z Funding Public Safety Educational Brochure

This proposal is for the design, printing, and mailing of a Public Safety Educational Brochure to City residents and businesses. Approximately 990 brochures will be mailed with the remaining available for distribution at City Hall for new residents and businesses.

The Public Safety Educational Brochure has been drafted by the City's Public Safety Commission (PSC). Their efforts commenced in May of 2015. A final draft is now available.

Funding will result in almost immediate impact. There remains confusion within the community as to whom to dial for sheriff services. Some residents think they should call City Hall, while others (outside of 911 callers) don't know to call dispatch at the 445-7251 number. Another challenge to community members is to report all "suspicious" activities. We know formally and informally that some residents have not reported law enforcement concerns.

We look to the educational brochure as a pro-active corrective measure to report all incidents. By doing so, the two dedicated Blue Lake officers can better do their jobs.

Blue Lake is an engaged community. The residents will appreciate this handy "whom and when" to call tip sheet.

Lastly, the brochure encourages the creation of Neighborhood Watch groups. A linked neighborhood goes a long way in preventing crime and making residents feel safe.

The Public Safety Commission has worked diligently to produce this document. We look forward to funding to ensure delivery to City businesses and residents.
