Big Picture Overview

- Humboldt County Fire Safe Council (FSC) established by the Board of Supervisors in 2002 to develop, implement, and maintain the Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP)
- FSC: diverse representation from many sectors
- Living with Wildfire an example of FSC's collaborative work; excellent resource for preparing, : <http://humboldt.gov/DocumentCenter/View/59108> [Copies of LWW handed out]
- CWPP Purpose: Guide and inspire action related to wildfire preparedness; Asses risk (community input and rigorous analysis)
- CWPP: 14 planning units, each with a Unit Action Plan that can be used independent of the Countywide Plan
 - Willow Creek Planning Unit Action Plan includes: Willow Creek and all residences in the surrounding

area

- Fire hazard severity: Humboldt county is vulnerable, we have been lucky in recent years, just a matter of time

Message from Willow Creek FSC, Barbara Darst, President of WC FSC and member of Humboldt County FSC

- Original FSC disbanded in 2000
- 2002 new FSC was brought together
- 2007 additional members joined and remain to this day
- Operate as a 501c3 (non-profit)
- 2010 first community to become Firewise
- Action plan includes FLASH, chipper days, Firewise community fair, youth ecology day (15 years!)
- Partners with USFS, WC chamber of commerce, community service district, VFD
- Outreach: Bigfoot days, parades, Oktoberfest info booths and fundraising
- Grants include Clearinghouse (USDA USFS) funded Willow Creek WPP and 45 acres of fuels reduction; PGE grant neighborhood cleanup programs, also helps purchase and maintain equipment; Title III LWW, Blue Dot program (hoping to update this year, community Firewise youth ecology day; First Five grant; SRA fees paid for fuels reduction throughout WC
- Looking for new members for FSC
- Available to chip fuels [form on the table]

Message from Fire Chief Willow Creek VFD, Nathan Falk

- All-volunteer, All-risk fire department
- Fire Chief's Association Annual Report will be available on County website soon
- New rescue truck just replaced a 20-year-old truck and is a great benefit to the community
- Working on getting a second fire station at Oak Lane and Patterson Road (other side of the bridge so folks on that side have help if bridge is compromised); 20 years in the making/saving up
- Working on getting info from USFS on where water resources are outside of Humboldt County; vital for initial attack
- Encouraged those interested to volunteer for the department, get the work out
- Currently have 17 firefighters (33 in 1995)
- Defensible space is important but Access is really important; engine is pretty tall and needs about 14 feet of vertical clearance
- Signage is also critical to find victims of medical calls etc., fire department needs green reflective signs (not wooden)

Message from CAL FIRE, Jason Butcher, SRA Forester and Humboldt County FSC member

[showed CAL FIRE video: Ready, Set, Go! <http://www.readyforwildfire.org/Ready-Set-Go-Campaign>]

- Fire-resistant building materials very important (esp. if remodeling or building new house)
- Defensible space gives firefighters space to protect the home
- Set: have documents in place, a plan, medications for people and pets
- Go: If an evacuation is called for, go early, don't wait
- Reiterated usefulness of Living with Wildfire publication: <http://humboldt.gov/DocumentCenter/View/59108>
- CAL FIRE Pre-fire Planning Unit Responsibilities: Prescribed fire program, fire safe regulations, Unit Fire Plan (coordinates with CWPP), defensible space inspections, grant administration (SRA fee) for fuel reduction and CWPP update
- Community input helps Willow Creek be prepared and will be used to prioritize projects when (financial) resources become available; encouraged participants to get in contact with CAL FIRE and identify themselves as property owners willing to partner on projects on their property/in the community
- Hopes to see increase fuel reduction work in future to 20,000 acres of black and 20,000 of treated (fuel breaks, etc.) annually state-wide
 - This unit a leader in black acres: 2,200 acres alone, this fiscal year by CAL FIRE and partners
- CAL FIRE relies on County data to plan prescribed burns and prioritize projects

Message from Office of Emergency Services, Bryan Lee

- Humboldt Alert: County-wide emergency alert system, <https://humboldt.gov/alerts>
 - Best way for emergency personnel to alert you about emergencies, i.e. evacuation
 - Alerts can be sent to landlines, cellphones (call or text), and email (personal info is confidential)
 - Redundancy is a good thing. Inputting all 3 into the system will ensure you get the message.
 - More efficient than emergency personnel knocking on doors
 - It is geographically targeted, meaning you will only receive alerts relevant to your geographic area
 - System can hold multiple addresses under one account (ex. home, office, child's school)
 - Can be used as a resource for fire dept. to notify community (contact OES directly)
- Household preparedness: in Humboldt, we need to plan for at least 2 weeks food/water, plan with family, reunification in case of downed communication
- Two-tiered evacuation:
 - Voluntary Advisory: Danger is close-by, be prepared to evacuate; leave now if you have pets/livestock, small children, one way in/out from your location
 - Mandatory Evacuation: Danger is imminent, leave immediately
- Tonight's mapping exercise: OES wants to know where one way in/out roads are, potential evacuation shelter sites, interest in Community Emergency Response Team (CERT)
- Sheriff's Office has a neighborhood watch program coordinated by Ginger Campbell
- CERT training upcoming February in Fortuna; training is free

What's on your mind?

- Storage/distribution of emergency supplies, especially masks
 - can be distributed to those unable to pick them up
- Emergency center (services, supplies)
 - unofficially: Elementary schools, high schools, Community Services District building; to be official would need to meet rigorous requirements
- Access issues
 - if USFS related you can contact them directly for an inspection
- Disaster response? Fire dpt, FSC, Sheriff's Office
 - depends on the disaster type, severity, etc.
 - Sheriff's Office works to funnel in resources from outside the area
 - residents should be prepared to be self-sufficient for 2 weeks minimum
 - community liaison would help coordinate
 - WC CERT, another group that could help
- Organize to lobby for tax incentive to support BMPs on private land (incentivize people not receptive to government enforcement)
- Hawkins Bar community center is the community evacuation site; lacking in supplies
- Rural areas isolated communication-wise; communication/power fragile
- Trinity Village needs blue dot promotion
- Evacuation routes, primary/secondary etc.
 - community liaison would be especially helpful here!
- Outreach to absentee owners with overgrown vegetation
 - letter from Cal FIRE after Defensible Space Inspection
 - Could emulate Neighbors helping Neighbors program
- Emergency sirens?
 - Responsibility of local fire department to maintain and communicate meaning to community
 - County does not have sirens
- Question: does department use Lat/Long to find people?
 - No. They do not currently have that capability on their rigs.

Mapping Exercise Intro

1. During the mapping exercise, we will work together in groups according to neighborhood/community (Willow Creek Planning Unit in Humboldt and in Trinity County) to add new information and to update information collected during previous CWPP workshops.

Participants are asked to identify potential projects by answering the question: What projects would you like to see implemented in your community and Planning Unit over the next 5 years?

2. Once the maps have been updated, participants are then invited to vote for the projects they'd most like to see completed by prioritizing those most realistic or important to implement.
3. After the votes have been tallied, each group will report out on their group's priorities.
