Humboldt Wind Project Planner,

We have submitted our May 20, 2019 comments on the DEIR for the Humboldt Wind Energy Project following our initial comment letter dated October 29, 2018 and a map showing our property with proposed wind turbine sites identified (attached).

An issue that is not addressed in the DEIR for the Humboldt Wind Energy Project that will have a significant environment impact to our property at Harrow Prairie Ranch are *ground vibrations* caused by operating wind turbine generators. Our concern is the ground shaking impact to the aquifer producing our spring water supply that exists within 1,000 feet of the nearest proposed turbine. This aquifer has produced both domestic and livestock water for our ranch since Harrow Prairie was first homesteaded in 1883. Operating wind turbines are known to emit ground vibrations. This environmental impact is not addressed in the DEIR. Additionally, proposed wind turbine siting will place a turbine adjacent to our access road at the top of Jordan Creek. This section of road would be significantly impacted by ground shaking impulses emanating from a proposed operating wind turbine. This environmental impact also needs to be addressed in the DEIR. We support the environmentally superior alternative for the proposed project that would eliminate all negative impacts to Harrow Prairie Ranch and the surrounding Bear Creek basin, that is the “No Project” alternative.
