This chapter represents over 112 **wildlife professionals and students from Humboldt, Del Norte, and Mendocino counties**. Our mission is to enhance the ability of wildlife professionals and wildlife students to conserve biodiversity, sustain productivity, and ensure responsible use of wildlife resources and habitats.

**We are writing to provide our professional opinion about the ecological impacts of the proposed Humboldt Wind Energy Project on wildlife and wildlife habitat.** Specifically, we are concerned that the baseline data on wildlife species is not adequate for detailed and through analysis of potential project impacts and that proposed project mitigation measures will not reduce project impacts to wildlife below the CEQA threshold of a significant impact. Our concerns are included in the attached letter.
