\*November 11 is a county holiday. The Humboldt County Office of Elections will be closed.

<b>Signatures in Lieu Petition (Optional)</b>	<b>September 12 – November 6</b>
<p>Candidates may submit a signatures in lieu petition to offset all or part of the filing fee for the office they seek. Signature values vary by office. Signature values and signatures in lieu required for each office are summarized on the previous page. Candidates are responsible for making copies of signature in lieu forms. Candidates may request the Office of Elections make copies of the signature in lieu form for \$.10 per page.</p> <p>Candidates must obtain signatures from voters who live in the district or political subdivision for which the candidate is seeking office. With respect to a candidacy for partisan office, signers shall be voters who disclosed a preference, pursuant to Elections Code, Section 2151, for the party, if any, for which the nomination is proposed. With respect to a candidacy for voter-nominated office, signers need not have disclosed a preference for any party.</p>	
<b>Declaration of Intention (Judicial Only)</b>	<b>October 28 – November 6</b>
<p>This document is available at the Office of Elections and is filed in the same location. If Incumbents have not filed a Declaration of Intention to succeed in the same office, any other qualified person may file a Declaration of Intention from November 7-11*.</p>	
<b>Nomination Papers – Central Committees</b>	<b>September 27 – December 6</b>
<p>Candidates seeking office for the Presidential Primary Election on March 3, 2020 must file a nomination paper. Candidates must obtain signatures from voters who live in the district or political subdivision for which the candidate is seeking office. With respect to a candidacy for partisan office, signers shall be voters who disclosed a preference, pursuant to Elections Code, Section 2151, for the party, if any, for which the nomination is proposed. The nomination paper must be delivered to the elections official of the county in which the signer resides and is a voter. <b>Nomination papers must be filed and signatures verified before the Declaration of Candidacy can be filed.</b></p> <p>Nomination papers can be obtained at the Humboldt County Office of Elections from November 11* – December 6. Nomination papers must be returned to the Office of Elections no later than December 6.</p>	
<b>Nomination Papers – County Offices</b>	<b>February 13 – March 9</b>
<p>Candidates seeking office for the Presidential Primary Election on March 3, 2020 must file a nomination paper. The nomination paper must be delivered to the elections official of the county in which the signer resides and is a voter. Candidates must obtain signatures from voters who live in the district or political subdivision for which the candidate is seeking office. With respect to a candidacy for voter-nominated office, signers need not have disclosed a preference for any party. <b>Nomination papers must be filed and signatures verified before the Declaration of Candidacy can be filed.</b></p> <p>Nomination papers can be obtained at the Humboldt County Office of Elections from November 11* – December 6. Nomination papers must be returned to the Office of Elections no later than December 6.</p>	
<b>Declaration of Candidacy</b>	<b>February 13 – March 9</b>
<p>The declaration of candidacy is the official nomination document, wherein a candidate indicates personal preference for a name and ballot designation will appear on the ballot.</p> <p>Candidates are required to complete and sign the declaration of candidacy at the Office of Elections. Candidates must take the oath of office (found on the declaration of candidacy form) before the elections official or a public notary.</p>	

## County Office Summary

### **Financial Filings – Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC)**

**Statement of Intention (Form 501).** Candidates for state or local offices in California must file a Form 501 at the Office of Elections before soliciting or receiving any contributions or before making expenditures from personal funds on behalf of a committee.

**Statement of Economic Interests (Form 700).** Candidates for state or local office (except central committees) in California must file a candidate Form 700 at the Office of Elections. At the time of filing declaration of candidacy, all candidates are required to file Form 700 with the County of Humboldt filing officer: Humboldt County Office of Elections. Form 700 must be filed with the filing officer by the final filing date for the declaration of candidacy.

**NOTE:** Candidates currently holding office will additionally be required to file an annual Form 700 for the 2019 calendar year.
