I. QUARTERLY NARRATIVE

A. Results/Outcomes

1. Please describe the Measure Z activities completed.

During 3rd quarter of the Measure Z funding from January 1, 2021 to March 31, 2021 the following Measure Z activities were completed.

In this quarter, the FPD agent at the Humboldt County Drug Task Force assisted in seizing over several pounds of fentanyl, heroin, methamphetamine and prescription narcotics. The FPD agent assigned to the Humboldt County Drug Task Force assisted in seizing firearms and large sums of currency related to illegal drug trafficking operations. In Humboldt County, a high percentage of heroin users are transitioning from heroin mixed with fentanyl to straight fentanyl use. This is resulting in an increase in overdose deaths associated with fentanyl. The following are some highlights from some of the publicized arrests and seizures during the reporting period that resulted from countywide investigations. Agents conducting investigations seized approximately ½ pound of fentanyl. Agents conducting investigations seized over 650 illegal prescription pills, which included Oxycodone and Xanax. In addition to the illegal prescription pills agents seized heroin, methamphetamine and anabolic steroids. Agents conducting investigations seized equipment for manufacturing assault weapons, an assault rifle, multiple handguns, silencers, high capacity magazines, large amounts of ammunition, fentanyl, and methamphetamine. In addition agents located and seized blood spattered clothing to conduct further investigation, as Drug Trafficking Operations often result in major violent crimes. Agents conducting investigations seized approximately 2 pounds of heroin. Agents conducting investigations seized 5,002 fentanyl pills while following up on an investigation into the overdose of a 13-year-old child. The child’s life was saved by law enforcement utilizing Narcan. In this quarter, Humboldt County Drug Task Force awarded FPD Agent with a letter of commendation for his outstanding performance throughout 2020.

Further specific investigative details are not listed due to the confidential nature of Humboldt County Drug Task Force investigations.

2. How many people have been served and how.

In this quarter, Measure Z funds are continuing to make a positive impact in our department and community. The FPD Humboldt County Drug Task Force Agent serves the entire population of Humboldt County. Since having a Drug Task Force agent in place at FPD, the Eel River Valley has seen a dramatic rise in drug enforcement activity. The FPD Agent continues to work with confidential informants, conduct undercover operations and execute search warrants, impacting drug trafficking operations throughout the county.

- 3. Who has benefited from the enhanced services.

The City of Fortuna, the Eel River Valley and the County of Humboldt continues to see great benefits with the addition of a FPD Drug Task Force Agent.

4. What difference did Measure Z funding make in our community and for the population you are serving? Measure Z funding of the FPD Humboldt County Drug Task Force Agent has given FPD a position with the task force that would not be in place otherwise. This position has allowed the FPD and the Humboldt County Drug Task Force to increase its drug enforcement efforts in the Eel River Valley, resulting in numerous large scale investigations, seizures and arrests. Additionally the added personnel to the Humboldt County Drug Task Force has allowed for increased enforcement throughout the county.

- 5. Please quantify the long-term impacts of your project. This would be for the entire time period that Measure Z has funded your project.

The Fortuna Police Officer assigned to the Drug Task Force has been Measure Z funded since August 2015. Since the inception of the FPD agent, our community has seen a direct impact on drug trafficking organizations and narcotics activity in our community and the county. Narcotics related investigations, seizures and arrests have greatly increased in the Eel River Valley. We have seen pounds of Heroin and Methamphetamine seized and many drug trafficking operations impacted. Many of the Humboldt County drug Task Force large scale seizures of Heroin and Methamphetamine have been made in the Eel River Valley.

- 6. Describe any unanticipated impacts of receiving Measure Z funding, positive or negative, not already described above.

The Measure Z funding of the Humboldt County Drug Task Force agent has been nothing but overwhelmingly positive and it has made a dramatic impact on the safety of our community. The addition of this position has resulted in many more narcotics investigations, operations, seizures and arrests in our community and countywide, making the entire county a safer place to live, work and enjoy. The Humboldt County Drug Task Force has continued to be impacted with the ongoing pandemic. The standard safety practices continue to be in place, regarding PPE and sanitization. As shown in this report, the Humboldt County Drug Task Force continues to make a profound impact on Drug Trafficking Operations throughout the county during the pandemic.

We cannot express enough that the addition of this position has resulted in many more narcotics investigations, operations, seizures and arrests in our community and countywide, making the entire county a safer place to live, work and enjoy.
